### Spraying & Pulling Weeds & Trimming

- Today all the Silverleaf Avenue entrances were sprayed for weeds. This includes the lift station, entrances at Old Tampa, Shimmering Oaks, Falling Leaf Court, 301 and Old Tampa Road.
- Lake tree rings in phase 4 and 6 were sprayed for weeds as long as they are far enough away from the lake bank.
- Light trimming was done on plant material that usually gets runners at all of the cottages today.
- On Silverleaf Avenue we did more ornamental bed clean up across from the Sand Pine entrance. (picture enclosed)

- Fire ant mounds were treated on mounds we saw down Silverleaf Avenue, also at the Wildgrass Cul-de-sac. Please remember we treat fire ants as a courtesy to avoid people getting bit especially near sidewalks etc. But this is not a service that is included contractually.
- Common area hedge behind Cottage Hill homes and in the Shade Tree dead end were lightly pruned and all vines were removed today.
- Today we walked the Publix wall area behind the Deep Creek Villas and again we found some debris that was thrown over the wall from the Publix side. We removed this debris today it was a few small piles.
- All of the models were sprayed for weeds today we also treated a few fire ants' mounds at the Liberty Model on Falling Leaf Court.
